

- **Q:** How do I disable my browser's pop-up blocker so that it doesn't block my access to UCPath?
- A: Completely disabling the pop-up blocker can leave your browser vulnerable to malicious software and intrusive ads. It's recommended that you add sites you want to allow to your exceptions list, such as UCPath, and keep your browser's pop-up blocker enabled.

To add the UCPath website as an exception to your pop-up blocker settings, complete the following steps for each browser you use to access UCPath.

- **1.** In the top right corner of the browser window, click 1 (Tools) \rightarrow **Internet options**.
- 2. On the Internet Options dialog box, click the Privacy tab.

- 4. On the **Pop-up Blocker Settings** dialog box, in the **Address of website to allow** field, type the UCPath web address (ucpath.universityofcalifornia.edu) and click the **Add** button to add it to the **Allowed sites** list.
- 5. Click the Close button to close the Pop-up Blocker Settings dialog box.
- 6. Click OK to close the Internet Options dialog box.

4. In the **Content settings** dialog box, scroll down to the **Pop-ups** section and click the **Manage Exceptions** button.



- 5. In the **Pop-up exceptions** dialog box, in the **Hostname pattern** field, type the UCPath portal web address (ucpath.universityofcalifornia.edu) and click the **Allow** button to add it to the allowed sites list.
- 6. Click the Done button to close the Pop-up exceptions dialog box.
